| Pollinator Pathway | Pollinator Pathway | Apply pollinator-friendly principles to any size property, including container gardens, with a goal of creating interconnected pollinator-friendly spaces. |
| Certified Wildlife Habitat | National Wildlife Fed- eration | Complete a checklist to certify your yard provides food, water, cover, and places to raise young for wildlife with a minimum goal of 70% native plants and no pesticide usage. |
| Homegrown National Park | Homegrown National Park, Doug Tallamy | Plant native plants, remove invasive plants, and add your property to a national map. |
