East Goshen Township: 47.3 up from 41.5 in 2000 Willistown Township: 48.2 up from 42.8 in 2000 West Goshen: 38.7 up from 36.6 in 2000

Population trends (2000-2010)

All age segments from 45 to 85 increased The 85 and older segment grew 211% 35 to 44 y.o. segment declined 24% Less that 5 y.o. segment declined 21%
